Analysis of the survey for community use of St Francis Hall

52 Survey responses between 8 March 2024 and 14 June 2024

The results have been analysed in two ways:

- 1. Overall results for each question. This shows respondents' feelings about each of the suggested uses yes, no and maybe. The pie charts give a visual indication of these preferences.
- 2. Results analysed by ranking them according to the number of 'yes' responses and the number of 'no' responses. This is useful to give an overall picture of what the most and least preferred choices were.

The last page shows the responses to the 'what else would you like to see' question.

Please bear in mind that although the survey has indicated some activities or uses of the hall gained more interest than others, this should be seen as a useful starting point and not a blueprint.
